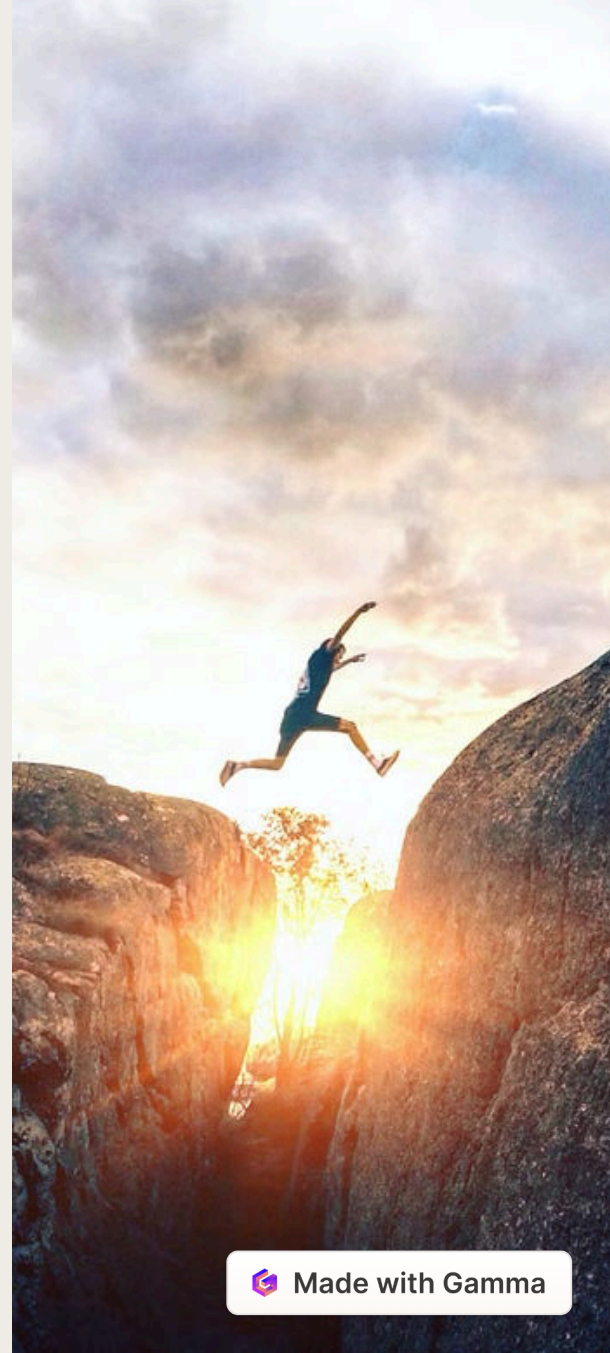
# Challenges and How to Overcome Them

## 2 Solutions

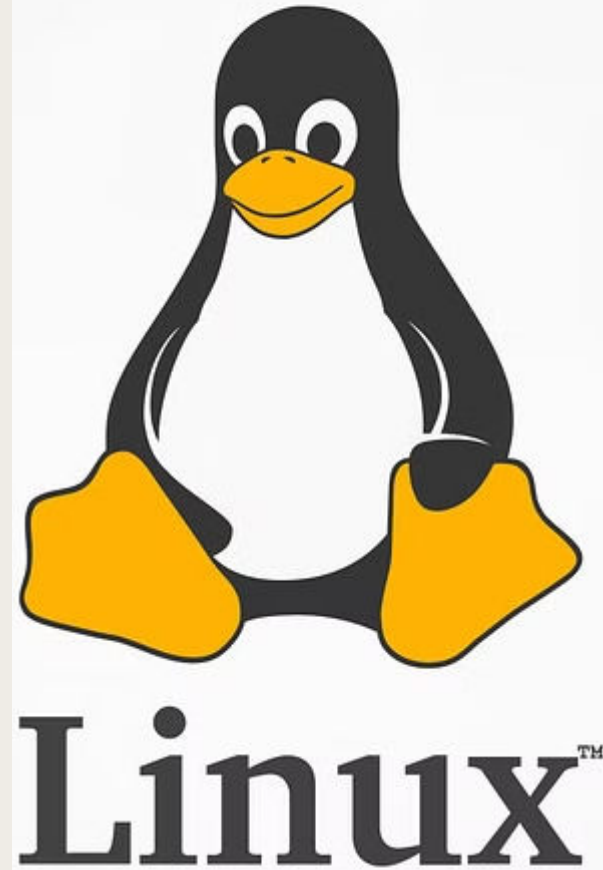
Overcoming these challenges may involve embracing the new culture and language, finding new friends, staying busy, and conducting intense research before moving.

# Negotiating and Interviewing on a Global Scale

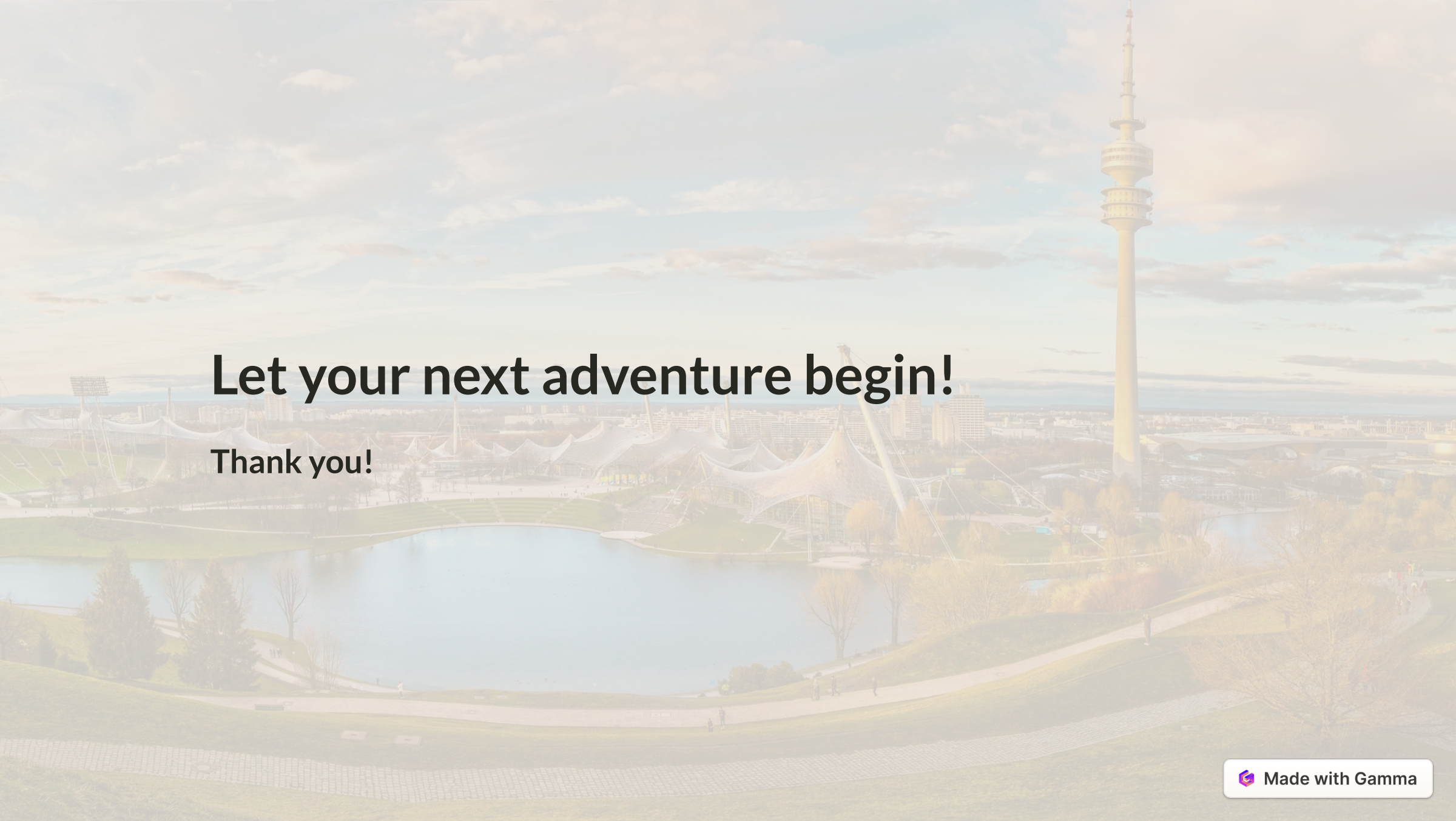
